London, April 21.—That the earth is elastic and pulled out of shape by action of the tides has been discovered by Prof. Milne, the leading English authority on earth phenomena. As the result of experiments he has found that twice in twenty-four hours, at high tide, the buildings along opposite sides of tidal basins "salute each other."

The experiments have been carried out at Bidston observatory, near Liverpoel, one and a half miles from the sea, with a modified form of seismograph, designed to record tidal effects, and the more minute movements which other seismographs would not or not often record.
