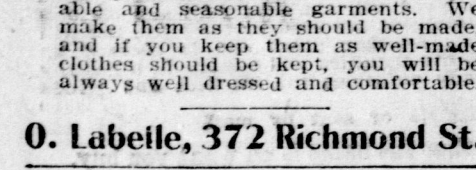

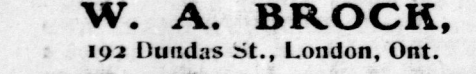

**FELL FROM THE MCCORMICK**  
**BUILDING; DIED INSTANTLY**

**Fatal Accident to Thomas Lewis,**  
Well Known Here.

**Death Came Before Assistance Could**  
**Be Given Him.**

THOMAS LEWIS lies  
dead at the home of  
his sister as the result  
of a fall yesterday  
afternoon at 2:30  
o'clock from the roof  
of McCormick & Co.'s  
new building. The  
deceased was working  
on the edge of the  
border house roof, a  
second story building.

slipped, and he fell between two build-  
ings, which are not more than 3 feet  
apart. His head struck an iron pipe at  
the bottom of the drop, which was
