WOODS' FAIR.

THE MARINE ESTIMATES

Prince Edward Island Cut Off From Mainland Since January.

Ottawa, March 16.—When the House went into supply today estimates of the marine and fisheries department were taken up. The total amount asked is \$400,000, of which \$40,000 is for maintenance and repairs of Government steamers and ice-breakers; \$34,000 was paid for repairs to the Lady Laurier, a new vessel. The Lady Laurier, it transpired, met with an accident, due to the displacement of a buoy, of which the agents of the department at Halifax had neglected to notify the captain.

Mr. Ames criticised the prices paid for coal which ran all the way from \$3 to \$5 a ton. He said the supplies of coal should be purchased by tender and in large quantities, in which case the price would be considerably lowered.

Messrs. McDonald (Pictou), Johnston (Cape Breton), and Mackenzie (Cape Breton) insisted that the Government should purchase coal at commercial rates, and not try to reduce the price of coal. Mr. Mackenzie was especially earnest in his protest. On the price of coal, he said, depended the bread and butter of hundreds of workmen.

An appropriation of \$9,000 for winter mail service started a breezy discussion. Mr. MacLean (Queen's P. E. I.) complained bitterly of the island services. Since Jan. 25th not a steamer had crossed to or from the mainland. Neither was the ice-boat service, and there is an absolute famine in some articles of farm consumption. Mr. MacLean held that the Government should take steps to provide for the service of a third steamer, which would be capable of keeping up the service under all conditions, pointing out that at Mackinaw there were steamers which maintained their timetables in the face of difficulties as

great as those on the Prince Edward Island route. Mr. MacLean's position was supported by Mr. Hughes (King's). Some forty-two petitions against the school clause of the autonomy bill were presented to the House.

OPPOSED TO THE SCHOOL MEASURE

Forest City Lodge, No. 762,
Places Itself On Record in
the Matter.

At the last regular meeting of Forest City Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 762, the following resolutions passed by an unanimous vote:

"Moved by Worshipful Bro. P. H. Wright, W.M., seconded by Worshipful Bro. T. Parkinson, P.M., and resolved: "That the officers and members of Forest City Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 762, view with alarm and very deep regret that bills have been introduced into the Parliament of Canada by Sir Wilfrid Laurier, making separate schools compulsory in the two new Provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan, to be supported by public funds, and we believe that it will be inimical to the peace, happiness and prosperity of the said Provinces, and we have earnestly hoped that the long and bitter sectarian strife of thirty or forty years ago would be forgotten, and that the struggle over the attempt to coerce Manitoba into the policy of endorsing purely sectarian schools would have been a warning sufficient to all parties herein to raise such an issue in Dominion politics. We deeply regret such warnings have apparently been unheeded, and that although the policy of Canada has been for many years the entire exclusion of state and church, there are still those to be found who, on the specious plea of religion in the schools, have dared to submit legislation providing for the endowment of sectarian schools in the new Provinces. Because of this anti-Canadian policy of endorsing creeds, this Forest City Loyal Orange Lodge, No. 762, places itself on record as utterly opposed to all state or local financial aid to any sectarian school, and we, the Protestants and Roman Catholics who love fair play to place themselves on record in opposing the introduction of any creed or creeds, and to join in pressing upon our representatives in Parliament that it is their duty to oppose every attempt to fasten sectarian schools on the new Provinces.

Annual Meeting of the Society—

The annual meeting of the Irish Benevolent Society was held in Somerset Hall, Dundas street, last evening, when reports reviewing the operations of the society during the past year were submitted, officers and committees were elected, and plans for the ensuing twelve months were discussed. The meeting was one of the largest in the history of the Benevolent, and what was still more satisfactory was the number of the younger generation who put in an appearance. Under the presidency of Mr. John Stevely, that most enthusiastic son of Erin, the society last year had possibly the most successful period in its long history, and there is every indication that this will be repeated this year. An almost entirely new staff of officers is at the head of affairs for 1905, and every one of them has the welfare of the Irish Benevolent at heart. The president is Mr. Philip Pocock, who was the right-hand man of the president during 1904, and he has as vice-presidents Messrs. Dennis Mason, Wm. McPhillips, and Stephen Grant, with Messrs. Thomas Wilson and P. F. Boyle as secretary and treasurer respectively. An executive committee composed of energetic workers will also aid the president.

Date of Picnic Fixed.

Before the election of officers was introduced, a number of routine matters were considered. The question of the annual picnic—always of so much interest to the society—was one of them. The officials of the Pore Marquette had been approached, and it was learned that no outings had yet been arranged at the lakeside for August. The society had been made up of the picnic to be held about the time of the reunion and semi-centennial in order that many of its visiting members might be able to participate, and this seemed to meet with general approval. The society accordingly agreed to have the picnic on Aug. 10, which is Thursday of the Old Boys' week, but did not name the place.

Progress was reported in the matter of securing the band of the Irish Fusiliers for an engagement in London, and also in the matter of securing permanent rooms for the society.

Messrs. John Gleeson and Ben Noble were named as the society's representatives on the sports committee of the Old Boys' Association.

The annual report of the retiring secretary, Dr. Claude Brown, stated that one word fittingly described the society's efforts of last year. That word was "Success." The meetings of the society and the committees have been well attended, the banquet and the picnic were as big drawing cards as ever, and the distribution of cheer had been the cause of making happy on Christmas Day many homes that were otherwise lonely.

Much of the success of the year, said the secretary, was due to President Stevely, who had in several instances been called upon to undertake, and had also filled his office with dignity.

Mr. P. Boyle, the treasurer, submitted a gratifying report, showing the receipts during the year to have been \$28,250 and the balance on hand \$17,223. The assets of the society total \$1,317 23, and the liabilities are nil.

The New Officers.

President Stevely next introduced the election of officers, and in retiring he took occasion to refer briefly to the past year's work. If there was one cause for regret it was the annual picnic. The outing was a financial success, yet had it not been for some unforeseen circumstances it would have been a still larger number.
