PARIS, June 11.—The *Press* expects a strong effort will be made by the Bonapartists for the success of their party in the coming supplementary election. The Paris journals say the Prince Imperial, not Prince Napoleon, will be put forward as a candidate for the Assembly.

VERSAILLES, June 12.—Trocchu made a long speech before the Assembly in justification of his administration of affairs.
