A MYSTERIOUS POISONER.

THE PROPER OF GALT EXERCISE BY A
THUNDERBOLT THUNDER.

Was Victim Dead and Another in a Precarious Condition - The Death of Galt was caused by the death of one victim, and is likely to result fatally in another instance. The facts, so far as they can be ascertained by the World to-night, are as follows:

By the last mail last night there arrived at the postoffice here three packages bearing the Toronto postmark. A post office stamp was upon each and the packages were addressed to Mrs. John Cherry, Miss May Lowell and Mrs. John Ridley, respectively, the latter being the wife of the incumbent of the English Church here.

Mrs. Cherry was the first to get her package from the post office this morning, and upon getting home she opened it and found the pastboard box inside of the wrapper contained three chocolate drops which she gave to her three children to eat. Shortly afterwards all the three showed signs of sickness and before the doctor arrived were in convulsions. The children, who are about 6 years old, is getting better, but the young one, about 2 1/2 years old, never rallied and died to-night. The other child is in a very critical condition and not likely to recover.

The several doctors in attendance give it as their opinion that the candies contained strychnine.

The news of the shocking affair spread rapidly, thus preventing Miss Lowell and Mrs. Ridley from partaking of any of the contents of their packages. Which also contained chocolate candy, but of a somewhat different shape and size and probably impregnated with the same deadly poison.

The different boxes were evidently sent by the same party. The handwriting on each was the same style and on each, but the boxes were of different sizes and had the appearance of being done up by some person not accustomed to that sort of work. They were certainly not sent out by any business firm to advertise their goods, as there are no marks upon them to indicate the name of the advertiser.

The motive that led to the perpetration of such a heinous act and who the fiend is remains a complete mystery.
