WARSAW, Dec. 24.—The Polish historian Vladislav Stolesky has been arrested. It is understood he is accused of plotting against the Czar.

DARK AS ERIBON.
A London Fog Thick enough to Be Cut With a Knife.

LONDON, Dec. 24.—A dense fog has set down here compelling suspension of traffic on the river and a great curtailment of the traffic on the streets.

The fog is not so thick as it has been, but it extends over a wide section of the city. It is without exception the worst of the kind that has come to London in years.

Fog is entertained that if the thick weather continues off the coast it will be the cause of many deaths.

There has been loss of life caused by persons losing their way and wandering into the rivers, and many other men and a girl have been reported to the police as missing.

The cold, damp weather is particularly severe upon persons suffering from lung diseases, and a large number of deaths are reported.

A dispatch from London says that three men, while walking along the canal, lost their way, fell into the water and were drowned.
