THE WORLD OF COMMERCE. VERY DULL SATURDAY.

Wall-Street Securities Are Stronger and Money Easy—Canadian Pacific and Cable Steady—Provisions Weaker—Latest Gossip From the Exchanges.

Saturday Evening, Aug. 10. Consols are steady to day, closing at 107 1/2 for money and at 107 1/8 for account.

Canadian Pacific is high in London, closing at 54 3/8. St. Paul closed at 72 1/2, Erie at 1-2, Reading at 9 and N.Y. at 10.

English farmers' deliveries of wheat the past week, 10,000 qrs. at an average price of 2s 2d.

Exports of wheat, flour included as wheat, from both coasts of the United States and from Montreal for the week amount to 1,550,000 bushels, against 1,400,000 bushels last week.

The output of gold continues, and excites some comment, says R. G. Dun & Co., because it is felt that the bond and stock market will be stimulated at once, if it is possible, by reducing the rate of exchange, but it is quite generally believed that a turn of the bonds originally taken for Europe is one cause of gold exports, and although the international bankers have been negotiating other American securities in large amounts, the shipments of domestic products are likely to be much delayed and smaller than usual.

Interference with the movement of the Trade Bulletin of Chicago estimates the world's visible wheat and flour on Aug. 10, 1895, at 15,000,000 bushels, against 14,600,000 bushels last year. It estimates that the winter wheat yield this year will be 24,000,000 bush.
