THERE has been a marked improvement in business since our last report, and sales to a considerable extent have been effected of curried leather, with a much more active demand for seasonable stock. Receipts, especially of desirable descriptions, have been to a comparatively limited extent.

SPANISH SOLE .- The local demand is not equal to the supply, and we hear of shipments to Liverpool of low grades. Prices are unchanged, though less firm.

SLAUGHTER SOLE .- Light weights are overlooked, but there is some enquiry for medium and heavy.

HARNESS .- The demand continues good, and with a light supply in market, prices are well maintained.

WAXED UPPER is in light demand, consumers having already supplied themselves to a considerable extent; but small receipts prevent any reduction in prices.

GRAINED UPPER is more inquired for, and with improved receipts, sales have been made to a fair ex. tent.

BUFF AND PEBBLED.—There is no particular demand for any but choice stock, of which larger sales have been effected.

PATENT AND ENAMELLED are quiet and without demand, but without any surplus stock in market.

CALF SKINS .- The receipts have been of small par cels of medium stock, which have been disposed of at about our quotations. There is very little prime to be had.

SPLITS.—The supply is considerably reduced at present, large sales at fair prices having been effected.

SHEEP SHINS.—There is a good demand for all kinds, which has caused a marked reduction in stocks. HIDES are scarce, and held only in small quantities. City Slaughter have advanced half a cent.

Wood.-We can hardly give quotations, as the market is quite unsettled, and no rates as yet established for the new clip. Farmers are reported as holding for higher prices than are at present offered.

WE have to report a good deal of activity in Shelf and Heavy Hardware during the past week.
