OUR FORZIGN LINGSION FUND

A few months since, the Church was asked to pay off a debt of \$2,500 that has been for some years on the Supplementing Fund. \$250 were asked from the ministers and \$2000 from the church. Both amounts have been paid.

Now our attention is called to the For eign Mission Fund, not to pay a debibut to see that therebe no debt when the year closes on the first of May. feet this gix thousand dollars will require to be raised during the next six weeks. Lost year Rev. K. J. Grant and Dr. Me. Kay raised during their visits about \$2509 and there were over \$700 in bequests. This aid with the ordinary contributions enabled us to begin the year free of debt, and in order to close the present year the came way this extra sum muct be contributed by the church. To every member of our church who has a cent or a dollar to give we would say that at the prezent time the Foreign Mission Fund has greater need of it than any other Schemo.

Our giving is bearing fruit. Aneltyum is paying \$150 of Mr. Annand's salary, while Erromange's Communion roll of 195 contains 33 teachers. In Trinidad we expended last year £1583 stg. Proprietors gave £1063; Native Churchec, £316; Denations in Trinidad £153; Government aid to Schools, £495; Sundries and Rent £91, in all £2123, making a grand total of £3706, so that the mission raises pound for pound, of our money, and has £540 stg., over. Are they not helping themselves? Has not the mission high claims on our effectious and our means?
