EXCHANGE OF NOTES

Mr. Le Ministre,

I have the honour to refer to the Note from this Legation, No. 103, of the November last regarding the **PROLONGING** of the **MODUS VIVENDI** between Canada and Uruguay for six months dating from the 1st November, 1938—a which terminated on the 30th April, 1939.

FOR SIX MONTHS THE COMMERCIAL "MODUS VIVENDI" OF 1936

BETWEEN

CANADA

AND

URUGUAY

Government of the Republic find it impossible to renew the **MODUS VIVENDI** before the end of April, 1939, but that Parliamentary consideration of the Trade Agreement will take place in the near future. In the circumstances, therefore, I submit to Your Excellency's consideration the above proposal for a further extension of the **MODUS VIVENDI** for another six months. The Canadian Government expresses its earnest hope that this long-standing may soon be settled, in accordance with the belief expressed in Your Excellency's Note of the 24th October last that the requisite approval would be granted. I should be grateful to receive an early opportunity, for communication to the Canadian Government.
