EXCHANGE OF NOTES BETWEEN CANADA AND TURKEY CONSTITUTING AN
AGREEMENT ON THE ISSUANCE OF MULTI-ENTRY VISAS TO DIPLOMATIC
REPRESENTATIVES AND OFFICIALS. (Canadian Note Dated February 9, 1951.)

SIR,

I have the honour to refer to previous correspondence on the subject of the modification of visa arrangements for diplomatic representatives and officials and their families and to state that the Government of Turkey is prepared to conclude with the Government of Canada an agreement in the following terms:

- (1) Diplomatic representatives and officials of Canada accredited in or posted to Turkey, as well as members of their families and staffs, who hold diplomatic, special or services passports may obtain, upon entry to Turkey, visas valid for an unlimited number of entries to or departures from Turkey during the appointment of the representatives and officials concerned in that country or for the period of validity of their passports, whichever is the lesser.
- (2) Diplomatic representatives and officials of Turkey accredited in or posted to Canada, as well as members of their families and staffs, who hold diplomatic, special or services passports may obtain, upon entry to Canada, visas valid for an unlimited number of entries to or departures from Canada during the appointment of the representatives and officials concerned in that country or for the period of validity of their passports, whichever is the lesser.

If the Government of Canada is prepared to accept the foregoing provisions, the Government of Turkey has the honour to suggest that this note and the reply thereto of the Government of Canada shall constitute an agreement between the two Governments which shall take effect on the thirtieth day following the date of the latter's note.
