

Strategy and in disability issues, prepare an annual report to Parliament. This report should contain a section that deals specifically, and in detail, with departmental activities related to Aboriginal people with disabilities. After tabling in the House of Commons, this report should be referred to this Standing Committee and to other appropriate parliamentary committees.

2 *The Committee recommends that:*

- a. On behalf of the Government of Canada, the Minister Responsible for the Status of Disabled Persons should table in Parliament an annual report on the National Strategy for the Integration of Persons with Disabilities and other government activities related to persons with disabilities. This annual report should contain details of grants and contributions, as well as program and policy initiatives related to persons with disabilities. This annual report should contain a section that deals specifically with activities taken to benefit Aboriginal people with disabilities. The annual report to Parliament should be referred to this Standing Committee and its successors, as well as to other relevant Parliamentary Committees.
- b. The Clerk of the Privy Council and Secretary to the Cabinet, the Secretary of the Treasury Board and the Secretary to the Cabinet for Federal-Provincial Relations should each name one senior official with sole and specific responsibility for all persons with disabilities. In the case of the Treasury Board, this official should report through the Program Branch.
