POLLUTION OF NAVIGABLE WATERS.

Mr. BRADBURY presented the first report of the Select Committee on the prevention of the pollution of navigable waters.

On motion of Mr. Bradbury, it was agreed, in accordance with recommendations contained in the said report, that the said committee have leave to have its proceedings and any evidence taken by it printed from day to day; that the quorum of the committee be reduced to six members; and that the committee have leave to sit while the House is in session.

Mr. BRADBURY moved:

That the reports and proceedings of and the evidence taken by the Select Special Committee appointed last session to consider Bills No. 2 and No. 116, Letter A of the Senate, respecting the pollution of navigable waters and laid upon the table on Monday, June 2, 1913, be referred to the Select Committee appointed to inquire into the prevention of the pollution of navigable waters.

Motion agreed to.

Mr. BRADBURY moved:

That a message be sent to the Senate requesting Their Honours to give leave to the Hon. Napoleon Antoine Belcourt, one of their members, to attend and give evidence before the Select Committee appointed to inquire into the prevention of the pollution of navigable waters.
