Referring to your letter of April 21st, I wish to thank you on behalf of the National Committee for your assurance of cooperation.

With reference to the Diamond Jubilee medals for competition in McGill University, this Committee is not disposed to impose any restrictions and is quite willing to leave the matter of eligibility to yourself and your governing body. Naturally, the Committee desires to get as wide publicity as possible and to have it generally known throughout the University that the National Committee recognizes the valuable work that is being done in Canadian history.

With regard to the time of competition, the Committee is also willing to leave this entirely to your judgment, provided the competition is held during the Jubilee year. If these medals could be awarded at your September convocation it would be very satisfactory.
