

INTERFERES WITH TORONTO'S RIGHTS

Provincial Hydro Commission's Order Criticized by Mayor.

WOULD MEAN A LOSS

No Comparison Between Toronto and London Systems, Says His Worship.

"If the citizens of Toronto will stand for this interference in their internal affairs by outside parties and interference with properly constituted and authorized management, on sane and prudent lines, then I am mistaken," said Mayor Hocken in his address to council relating to the reduction of Hydro-Electric rates in Toronto. "The Toronto Commission are by special act vested with the management of the Toronto system on behalf of the citizens, and I submit that no order of the provincial commission constitutes a gross and unwarranted interference with the rights of the Toronto commission by a body whose financial responsibility in connection with the enterprise is of a most limited nature." If the reduction was made there would be a loss of \$22,000 for the year's operations. "The Hydro system is being subjected as distinctly hostile and deliberately unfair," the mayor said. "Were a private enterprise to be handled the way the Evening Telegram has handled the local Hydro, the morale of its staff would soon be destroyed, the respect and confidence of all its employees in their superior officers would be undermined and the whole enterprise would be disorganized and ruined."

Regarding the comparison that has been made between the situations in Toronto and London the mayor pointed out that the London commissioners controlled both the water and electric supply, and that London had no underground plant such as Toronto, hence the difference in rates.

Summing up the claims of the Toronto commissioners the mayor said that the provincial commission have established their claim even after shifting from the ground originally taken.

TWO TRAINMEN WERE INJURED IN A WRECK

Horse on Track Ditched Train Near Wingham Yesterday Morning.

WINGHAM, June 1.—The early train, which left Kincardine at 5:30 a. m., was derailed two miles north of Wingham this morning by a horse on the track. Mr. S. Moorehead, engineer, and Mr. Joseph Harrington, fireman, were injured when the engine rolled into the ditch. Both men were taken to the Wingham Hospital, where they now lie. They were badly shaken up, but not seriously injured. The balance of the train remained on the track. There were no other casualties.

AGED GALT RESIDENT DEAD

GALT, Ont. June 1.—In the death of Mrs. William H. Scott, 72, the town loses one of its oldest residents. She had lived here continuously for 67 years and came to this town from Aberdeen, Scotland. Her mother died eight years ago at 102.

True Bills Returned Against Alleged Slayers of Constable Bourdon.

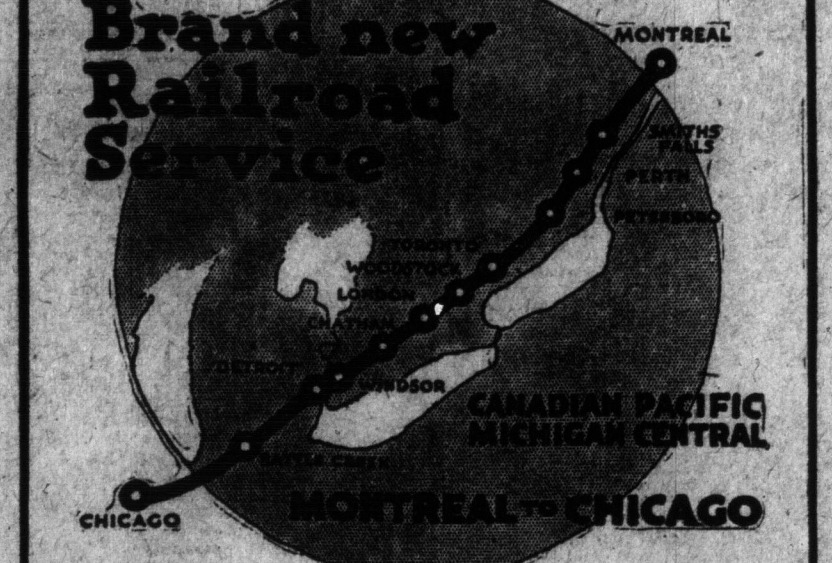

Will Be Kept in Barrie Jail Pending Trial in Fall.

BRACEBRIDGE, Ont. June 1.—William Rutan, the murderer of Mrs. Alfred Coutermanche and George Coutermanche, was given his preliminary trial on Saturday afternoon before Police Magistrate Spencer, Crown Attorney Johnson appearing for the prosecution, while Rutan appeared without counsel. He was committed for trial at the fall assizes here on charges of murder and arson and will be removed to Barrie jail along with the Moreau brothers until fall for more secure confinement.
