

SHALL in the following Account omit the Accidents that befel us in our Passage, being such as are inseparable from all great Voyages, and begin with my Arrival at Quebec, from whence we

went up the River St. Lawrence Southwards, till we came to Fort Frontenac, diftant from Quebec one hundred Leagues. It was built to prevent the Excursions of the Iroquese, and to interrupt the Trade of Skins, these Savages maintain with the Inhabitants of New-Tork, who furnish them with Commodities at cheaper Rates than the French of Canada.
