A Common Council holden in the Chamber of the *Guildhall* of the City of *London*, on *Tuesday*, the Sixteenth Day of *December*, 1766.

A Motion was made, and Question put, That the Freedom of this City be presented to his Royal Highness the Duke of *Cumberland*, in Testimony of the dutiful Attachment of this Court to his Majesty and his illustrious House, and as a Mark of their profound Respect for his Royal Highness, whose princely Accomplishments have justly endeared him to all his Majesty's Subjects; and that his Royal Highness be humbly requested to honor this City by his Acceptance of the said Freedom? The same was unanimously resolved in the Affirmative, and ordered accordingly.

Another Motion was made, and Question put, That a Copy of the said Freedom be presented to his Royal Highness in a Gold Box, of the Value of One Hundred and Fifty Guineas? The same was unanimously resolved in the Affirmative, and ordered accordingly.
