In our Sentinel of the 5th instant we briefly noticed the result of the Appeal by the Owners of the brig *Aurora* to the High Court of Admiralty, from the decision of the Vice-Admiralty Court of this Island, in the case of Mr. SAMUEL G. CARTER against that vessel for Salvage; since when we have received a full report of the same, in a late London paper, which we now lay before our readers. In doing this it may not be amiss to remark, for the information of such as are not acquainted with the fact, that Sir WILLIAM SCOTT, in all his decrees which we recollect to have read, is more liberal than otherwise in rewarding services of this nature, as he argues very justly that every encouragement should be given to induce people to render their assistance where life or property is in danger.
