

and judgment to the legal tribunals constitutionally organized. No exception can be admitted. In this category every Judge is included and so is every Court. As our Court of Appeal must yield to the decisions of the Queen in Council, so must Judge Stuart. But if he can resist one Court he can resist the other, thus constituting himself the great all absorbing one man power. I have obeyed and will continue to obey the law, reserving to myself the right to appeal when dissatisfied. But here there is, owing to reasons which will, I trust, henceforward be perfectly appreciated, no effectual appeal to constituted authority. Hence this prayer for the application of the lawful pressure of public opinion.
