the Society and entered in the books thereof, on pain of being dismissed from it, and having their names erased from the list of Members.

ARTICLE XXVIII.

OF THE MODE OF ALTEBING THE CONSTITUTION.

The Constitution shall not be altered, except at a Preparatory Meeting, at which the President or one of the Vice-Presidents, and not less than fifty Resident Members are present, the consent of three-fourths of whom shall be necessary to ratify an amendment; and all proposed amendments shall be submitted to the consideration of the Society at the previous Meeting.
