Cudgel Makes New Record at Saratoga

Saratoga Springs, N.Y., Aug. 16.—A new world's record for a mile and three-sixteenths was established by Commander J. K. L. Ross' four-year-old Cudgel in the fourth race, the Schenectady Handicap, here this afternoon. Cudgel carried United Child, Soria, also ran.

The track record fell in the last race of five furlongs, when J. W. McClelland's two-year-old colt Eternal traveled the distance in 58 2-5 seconds.

CROP MAY BE LOST THRU LACK OF LABOR

Fredericton, N.B., Aug. 16.—"Unless something is done to secure labor for the farmers of this province within the next five or six weeks a large portion of this season's crop will be lost," says the Hon. J. F. Tweeddale, minister of agriculture, in an interview on the labor situation.

WINTER STORAGE FOR VEGETABLES

SUGAR ALLOWANCE CUT FOR CANNED FRUITS

Ottawa, Aug. 16.—As an additional sugar conservation measure, the food board has ordered that, until further notice, manufacturers of canned fruits for sale must not use more than an average of 25 pounds of sugar to 100 pounds of prepared fruits. The order is now effective. It does not apply to jams, jellies or marmalades.

According to tests made by the Canadian Government, milking machines to operate properly should take into account the heart beats of the cow. Examinations have shown that there is a relatively small amount of milk in a cow's udder at any one time, says the September Popular Mechanics Magazine.

KILLED BY STREET CAR.

Windoor, Aug. 16.—Injuries sustained when she was knocked down by a street car in Detroit last night caused the death in Grace Hospital today of Mrs. Clara E. Clark, aged 73. Mrs. Clark was a resident of Windsor for 60 years, only recently moving to Detroit to keep house for her son, George Clark, a prominent official of the Detroit and Cleveland Navigation Company.

HINDOOS ARRESTED.

Cornwall, Aug. 16.—U. S. immigration officers have arrested nine Hindoos and one West Indian at Massena the Hindoos being charged with entering the country illegally and for coming from a barred zone. They all claim to have been sailors on British boats which were torpedoed, and being landed at New York deserted their boats and were sent to Massena by employment agencies.
