Here is a tale of two tenders. For some years past, D. H. Atkinson has had the privilege of collecting fees and driving fees at the City Cattle Market. Last year he paid the city \$34,800 for the right. R. Hunter lately came out with the proposition that a higher figure than that would be paid for the 1906 privilege. There were some cattle men who held different views and were willing to back them up with wads of money. There was a fair amount of betting, till Mr. Hunter settled the question by tendering over the \$36,000 mark. Mr. Atkinson, whose bid was something over \$31,000, thereupon complained to the board of control that his competitor had been unfair.

The board isn't yet awarded the contract. As matters now stand, the tenderer may back out at any time on giving thirty days' notice.
