COMPLETELY WIPED OUT!

Serious Result of the Bear Island Fight.

A Force of Eighty U. S. Troops Annihilated.

Minneapolis, Minn., Oct. 6.—Arthur P.

Pegler, the staff correspondent of the

Journal, wires at 8:30 this morning,

from Walker, Minn.:

"The force of 80 men under Gen. Ba-

con have been annihilated. I do not

know whether Inspector Tinker has

more information than I have, but he

sent word to the war department last

night that the Third Infantry detach-

ment had been wiped out.

"Either the troops have been driven

inland, or there is not a man of them

left. No answer from the signals of

any kind was received, although we

lay off on the whole length of the

headland. To land was an impossibil-

ity in the dark, as the reinforcements

from Brainerd have not arrived."
