WAKES AFTER LONG SLUMBER

Hospital Patient Has a Three-Months Spell of Napping Following Operation.

Norristown, Pa., Aug. 21. - William Schnable, aged 36 years, of Edge Hill. has just been awakened from a sleep which continued for over three months and baffled a number of leading Philadelphia specialists, who worked upon the remarkable case at the University of Pennsylvania Hospital.

While going down a flight of cellar stairs last March, Schnable was struck on the head and knocked unconscious. Recovering consciousness, he was found to be all right physically, but there was some derangement


