The Government has given up hope of finishing up the business in two more weeks, as had been anticipated a short time ago, and it will run at least another three weeks. Hon. A. G. Mackay Is WOULD HAVE GOVT. Dead at Edmonton After Brief Illness

Former Ontario Liberal Leader Succumbs-Burlal At Owen Sound.

EDMONTON, April 25.—Hon. A. G. Mackay, M.A., K.C., M.L.A., minister of health and of municipal affairs in the Alberta Government, died this morning at 4:30 o'clock after an illness morning at 4:30 o'clock after an illness of less than two weeks. Heart-failure following an attack of pneumonia, was the cause. The body will be taken east for interment at Owen Sound, Ont.

The Hon. Mr. Mackay came to Edmonton in 1912 from Ontario, where he was for a time leader of the Liberal Opposition in the Provincial Legislature. He was soon recognized as one of the ablest criminal lawyers in Alberta.

He was elected a member of the legislature for Athabasca in 1913 and entered the Government in 1918 as minister of municipal affairs, to which was later added the department of health. His administration of these departments won him high commendation from political opponents as well as friends, and the progressive health legislation of the last two years will remain as a monument to his administration.

German Protestant Synod Gives Vote of Thanks To Wilhelm.

Berlin, April 26.—A vote of thanks to former Emperor William, as last temporal head of the Protestant State Church, was given at the closing session of the annual general synod. The synod also paid a tribute to the former monarch and his consort for having "in many ways testified to their practical Christian spirit by works of love toward their brethren."

The synod passed a resolution to the effect that the future—path of the church lay in the direction of a state free church embracing all the German peoples. It added that while the church would welcome within its fold adherents of all political parties, it would itself avoid all politics.

Sonora Troops Take Mexican City; Meet With NoResistance

Los Angeles, Cal., April 25.—The city of Guaymas, Sonora, on the Gulf ocalifornia, was captured April 12 without a shot being fired by 5,000 Sonora state troops commanded by Gen. Angel Flores, according to Capt. N. K. Jacobson of the Gulf mail steamer Nehaimen, from Torreon to San Francisco, which arrived here today.

SEE CANADA'S TOTAL NEAR NINE MILLION PEOPLE THIS YEAR

Ottawa, April 25.—Officials of the board of census and statistics, while reluctant to make any estimates of Canada's population, are inclined to believe there are eight and three-quarter million people in the country at the present time. They admit, however, that this is merely a calculation, and that the figure may prove to be higher. When the census of the three prairie provinces was taken in 1916, census officials looked for an increase in five years of only 16 per cent, but the increase proved to be 26 per cent. It is pointed out that abnormal conditions in Canada of late years have tended to make population estimates more difficult than usual.

BOYCOTT BRINGS DOWN PRICE OF POTATOES

Hamilton, April 25.—The price of potatoes on the market here dropped on Saturday from \$6.50 to \$5.50, and the women's boycott is said to have caused the drop.

The dead are: Jacob Wolf and his wife, five little daughters, and Jake Hofer, 13, who was employed on the farm. Only one member of the family escaped, Emma. 8 months old.

At the inquest begun this morning, 1t was brought out that Wolf and one of the children had been shot, the others killed with a hatchet.


