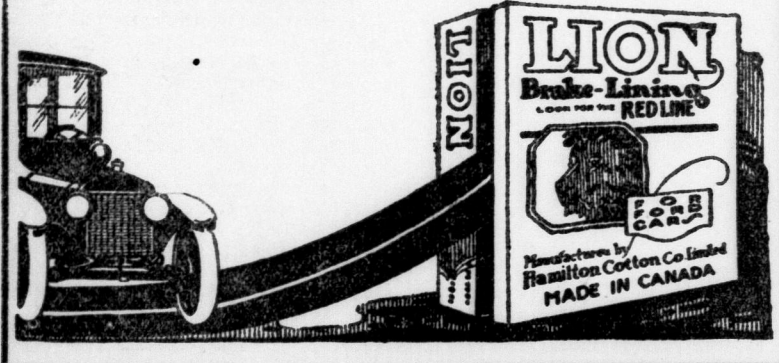

END OF SESSION IN LEGISLATURE DRAWS NEARER

Dropping of the Contentious
Clauses Will Shorten
Up Debates.

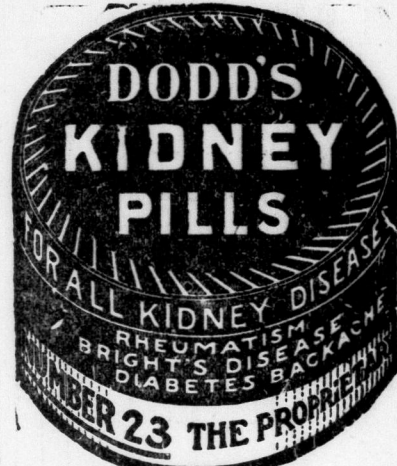
NEED THREE WEEKS YET

Drury Government Has Given
Up Hope of Finishing in
Fortnight.

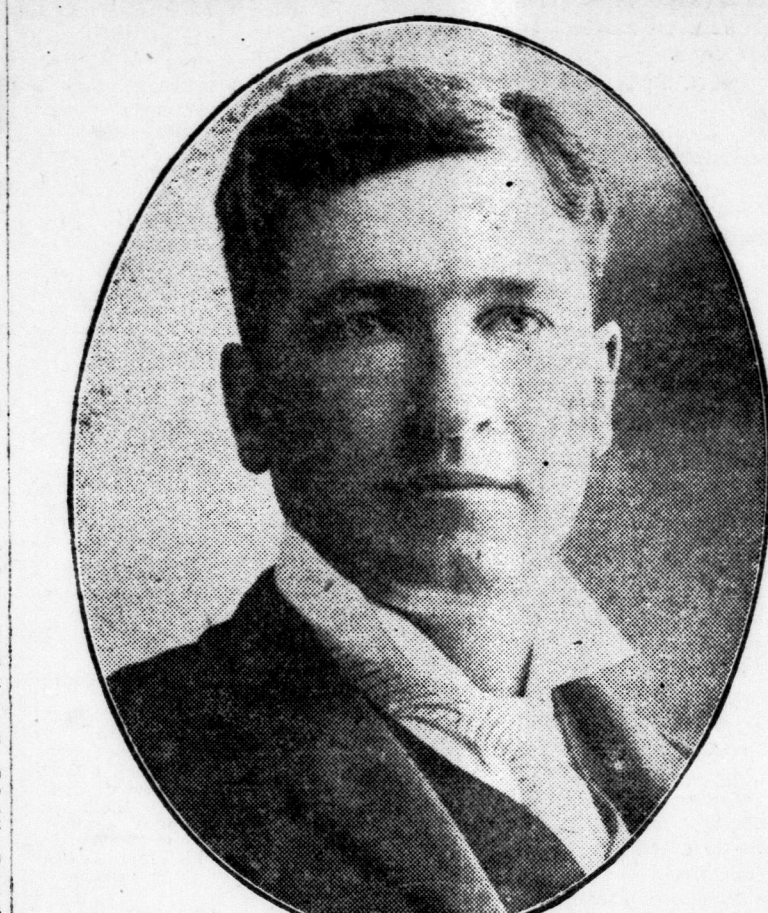
TORONTO, April 23. — With the dropping by the Government of the chief clause of contention in the new election act, that on which the next provincial elections shall be held, and possibly sending proposed important changes in the workmen's compensation act over until the next session, the close of the present session draws appreciably nearer.

The Government has given up hope of finishing up the business in two more weeks, as had been anticipated a short time ago, and it will run at least another three weeks. The most contentious clause in the proposed changes in the compensation act is that relating to increasing the benefits from 65 to 75 per cent. This is so great a change that in view of the fact that the employers have not been given an opportunity to state their views on the matter, and the amount the province would have to pay under the new scale is so large, the decision on the question may be postponed until next year. In the meantime, some minor changes may be made in the act.

The vote on the McCreary resolution asking for a referendum on the liquor importation question will probably be taken on Tuesday. The budget debate may use up a good deal of time this week, but it is possible that it may peter out suddenly.



FORMER LEADER OF ONTARIO LIBERALS DIES AT EDMONTON

Hon. A. G. Mackay Is Dead at Edmonton After Brief Illness

Former Ontario Liberal Leader Succumbs—Burial At Owen Sound.

EDMONTON, April 25.—Hon. A. G. Mackay, M.A., M.L.A., minister of health and of municipal affairs in the Alberta Government, died this morning at 4:30 o'clock after an illness of less than two weeks. Heart-failure following an attack of pneumonia, was the cause. The body will be taken east for interment at Owen Sound, Ont.

The Hon. Mr. Mackay came to Edmonton in 1912 from Ontario, where he was for a time leader of the Liberal Opposition in the Provincial Legislature. He was recognized as one of the ablest criminal lawyers in Alberta.

He was elected a member of the legislature for Athabasca in 1915 and entered the Government in 1918 as minister of municipal affairs, to which was later added the department of health. His administration of these departments won him high commendation from political opponents as well as friends, and the progressive health legislation of the last two years will remain as a monument to his administration.

PALESTINE WILL GET BETTER GOVERNMENT

British Delegates Promise an
Improvement in Admin-
istration.

LONDON, April 24.—Assurances have been given Zionist representatives by British delegates here that the military administration of Palestine, which has been far from satisfactory to the Jews, will be changed to a sympathetic civil rule. Zionists are represented in San Remo by Benjamin Cohen, Chicago, Ill., who came from Palestine with Dr. Chayim Weizmann, president of the world Zionist commission there.

"Zionism as a political movement has ended," said Mr. Cohen today, "with the creation of a national Jewish home. Its work now is the development of Palestine and the taking there of Jewish immigrants from Eastern Europe. This development will be largely agricultural."

Palestine now has a population of 700,000. In the time of David it had 2,000,000.

CHURCH PAYS TRIBUTE TO EX-GERMAN RULER

German Protestant Synod
Gives Vote of Thanks
To Wilhelm.

Berlin, April 25.—A vote of thanks to former Emperor William, as last temporal head of the Protestant State Church, was given at the closing session of the annual general synod. The synod also paid a tribute to the former monarch and his consort for having "in many ways testified to their profound Christian spirit by works of love toward their brethren."

The synod passed a resolution to the effect that the future path of the church lay in the direction of a state-free church embracing all the German peoples. It added that while the church would welcome within its fold adherents of all political parties, it would itself avoid all politics.

Sonora Troops Take Mexican City; Meet With No Resistance

Los Angeles, Cal., April 25.—The city of Guaymas, Sonora, on the Gulf of California, was captured April 12 without a shot being fired by 5,000 Sonora state troops commanded by Gen. Anacleto Flores, according to Capt. N. K. Jacobson of the Gulf mail steamer Nehalem, which arrived here today.

SEE CANADA'S TOTAL NEAR NINE MILLION PEOPLE THIS YEAR

Ottawa, April 25.—Officials of the board of census and statistics, while reluctant to make any estimates of Canada's population, are inclined to believe there are eight and three-quarter million people in the country at the present time. They admit, however, that this is merely a calculation, and that the figure may prove to be in error. When the census of the three prairie provinces was taken in 1916, census officials looked for an increase in five years of only 18 per cent, but the increase proved to be 25 per cent. It is pointed out that abnormal conditions in Canada of late years have tended to make population estimates more difficult than usual.

BOYCOTT BRINGS DOWN PRICE OF POTATOES

Hamilton, April 25.—The price of potatoes on the market here dropped on Saturday from \$6.50 to \$5.50, and the women's boycott is said to have caused the drop.

Eight Found Dead on Farm; Victims of Mystery Tragedy

Turtle Lake, North Dakota, April 25.—Eight persons were found dead yesterday at the farm home of Jacob Wolf, three miles north of here, the victims of a mysterious tragedy. The dead are: Jacob Wolf and his wife, five little daughters, and Jake Hofer, 13, who was employed on the farm. Only one member of the family escaped, Emma, 8 months old.

At the inquest begun this morning, it was brought out that Wolf and one of the children had been shot, the others killed with a hatchet.

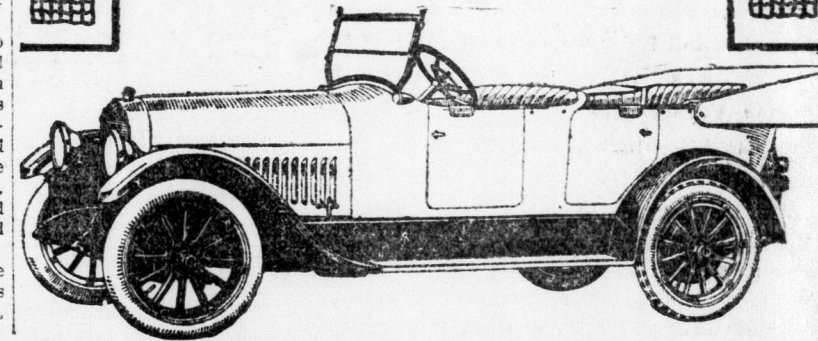

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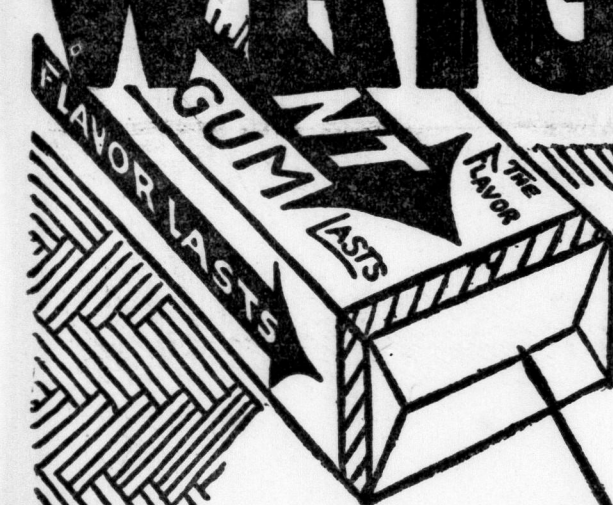
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
