### THE CONTRASTING PRINCIPLES

(Ottawa Journal.)

A story from the trenches published in The Journal a couple of days ago told how a succession of phobias appeared above a German trench, the first reading "The English are fools," the next "The French are fools," the third, "We are fools," and finally the last, "Let's all go home." A correspondent, writing himself "Common Sense," who does not give his real name, sends in a letter in which he says:—"Just think, last night, right? What's the use of it all?" With anyone who asks a question like this, after what the world knows today, with Miss Cavell's blood hardly dry and the shrieks of the Agassiz's women and children still in the air, nothing can be gained by pointing to ideals of any kind as explaining human action. You could not impress anyone by pointing to ideals, and the character which still asks "What's the use of it all?" is akin to that of a grine.

It is conceivable, however, that even a human being would rather live under conditions in which he is admitted to have some right to run his own show as he pleases, with due regard to the rights of his neighbors, and to have a voice in the general running of the whole, than to live under conditions in which some self-constituted boss arrogates the right to give him a kick on the stern every time he wiggles his tail without permission. Accordingly the following resolution is recommended to his attention as illustrating what will be the rules if the British troops were to go home and would have been the rules if they had not come out.

At Kensington—"Here my grandfather, the crown of Prussia upon his head, thereby emphasizing once more that it was given him by God's grace alone—and not by parliaments or National assemblies."

Brantford, March 1890—"Those who oppose me, I will smash."

May, 1891—"There is only one who is master in my empire, and that is I. I shall brook no other."

Polsdam, Nov. 25, 1891—"Children of my class, you are my slaves. You have to submit to me body and soul."

Nov. 10, 1893—"I demand you to do your own relations."

Nov. 10, 1893—"You (soldiers) must all have one will, and that is my will. There is only one law, and that is my law."

Berlin, Nov. 10, 1893—"The King is the God of grace, therefore he is only responsible to the Lord."

Nov. 10, 1893—"I shall be a King, by divine right."

Nov. 10, 1893—"Freedom of religion, and freedom for scientific research—that is the liberty I want. I do not want to be governed by a man, but by a law."

Nov. 10, 1893—"I want to be a King, or a man not suited to work. If they like they can go in search of a job."

Königsberg, Aug. 25, 1910—"I shall go my way. ... Considering myself as a nation, I shall say no."

And, on the contrary, as to why our British soldiers are in France, and why they have not come home yet, the answer is gained, we shall use in part and with slight changes, the words that were spoken by one of the greatest of men in a former great war:

"Our fathers brought forth ... a nation conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the views and opinions of the day."

"Now we are engaged in a great war, testing whether that nation, or any nation, can endure."
