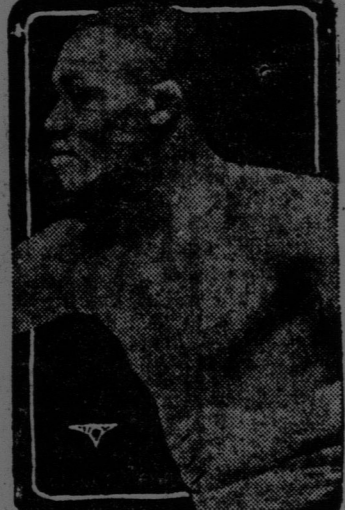


LOOK OUT, YOU JACK JOHNSON; LANGFORD STILL CARRIES A KICK
