the past year averaged 200, shewing an increase of 33 over the former year. 235 copies of the Juvenile Presbyterian, and of the Sabbath School Messenger were circulated monthly among the scholars. The scheme of lessons used was that prepared by the Minister for the other Sabbath Schools within the bounds of the Synod. The School maintains an orphan, named Margaret Machar, at the institution in Calcutta. Its revenue and expenditure were as follows:-

The number of Teachers in the Portsmouth School is 7; and of scholars on the roll, 100. The attendance for the past year averaged 75. In conjunction with Barriefield, it supported an orphan at Calcutta, named Janet Harkness. Its revenue was \$67.84, and expenditure \$66.74, leaving a balance in Treasurer's hands of \$1.10. Mr. Paton continues to superintend this school.

The number of teachers in the Barriefield school is 5; and of scholars on the roll, 50. The amount collected in it last year, for missionary purposes, was \$6. Its scholars, along with those of Portsmouth school, enjoyed a steamboat excursion to Wolfe Island. The services of a regular Superintendent (Mr. G. M. Macdonell) have been secured for this

The number of teachers in connection with St. Andrew's Church in the Montreal Village Union Sabbath School, is 3; and of scholars, 18.
