THE POISONING CASE.

No event that has occurred in St. John for many years has excited as much horror and indignation in this community as the attempt to poison four ministers and their families by means of poisoned candy, an attempt which resulted in the loss of one valuable life.

The first important feature of the case is the fact that the four persons here to whom the poisoned candy was addressed were a Methodist, a Baptist, a Presbyterian and a Methodist.

It has been suggested that this murder must have been the work of a crank, but this view of the case is hardly tenable. Cranks are seldom murderers, by far the greatest proportion of the crimes of this character have for their motive revenge.

NOTE AND COMMENT.
