A Short Meeting of the Board—Only Routine Business Transacted.

There were present at last evening's meeting of the water commissioners Chairman F. F. Quinn, Mayor Patterson, and Dr. Holmes, with Ald. Cleve.

The following accounts were passed: Banner, \$23.25; Baxter, \$1.51; Park Bros. \$19.97 and 18.03; Dunn & Stinson, \$28.50; O. B. Hulin, \$12.30; Norwood Engineering Co., \$57; Thompson Foundry Co., \$284.41; McKough & Trotter, \$251.78; Hocking Coal Co., \$140.65.

D. M. Martin was granted a water meter, the expense being charged to him.

An extension of mains was granted at the request of W. W. Daniels, who desired a service on Selkirk St.

On motion the secretary was instructed to purchase six additional meters.

The mayor's request for extension for lawn purposes was granted.

The application of the Maple City Athletic Club for free water for the ensuing year was granted.

A letter was received from Secretary Bryce, of the Provincial Board of Health in response to the commissioners' communication re the dumping of the London sewage in the Thames. Dr. Bryce stated that on completion of the system the Forest City would have to provide proper sanitary protection, and that they had been notified to this effect.
