

Course of Instruction in the Faculty of Medicine.

(The Didactic Lectures are delivered in the College Building, corner Carlton and College Streets.)

I.—MEDICINE.

Prof. RED, Superintendent of Provincial Hospital for the Insane.

Divided into Principles and Practice. This course will be illustrated by Coloured Plates, Morbid Preparations, and recent Pathological Specimens.

Text Books.—Tanner, Flint, Watson, Barlow, Niemeyer, Reynolds Ziemssen.

II.—SURGERY.

Profs. FARRELL and LAWSON, Surgeons to Provincial and City Hospital, City Dispensary, Orphans' Home, and Institution for the Blind.

Divided into Principles and Practice, including Surgical Anatomy and Operative Surgery, exhibited on the subject. The various surgical instruments and apparatus are shown, and their uses and mode of application illustrated.

Text Books.—Druitt, Erichsen, Gross, Holmes, Bryant.

III.—OBSTETRICS.

Prof. SLATTERY, Consulting Surgeon to Provincial and City Hospital.

Prof. WOODILL, Physician to Provincial and City Hospital.

This course includes Diseases of Women and Children, and is illustrated by plates, manikins, etc. Every facility is given to senior students for attending midwifery cases at the Almshouse and Dispensary, under the direction of the medical officers.

Text Books.—Obstetrics—Bedford, Tyler, Smith, Cazeau, Leishman. Diseases women—Thomas, Ziemssen. Diseases of children—West, Smith.

IV.—CHEMISTRY.

The Lectures on this subject will be given by Prof. GEO. LAWSON at Dalhousie College.

This course is illustrated by Diagrams, Tables, Apparatus, Preparations and Demonstrations on the black-board.

PRACTICAL CHEMISTRY.

The instruction in this department is given at the College Laboratory.
