JACKSONVILLE, Jan. 28. No event in the sporting world for a long time past has created so great an interest as the fight arranged to take place today somewhere in Florida between James J. Corbett, of California, and Charles Mitchell, of England, for the Championship of the world, and stakes amounting to \$30,000.

Strenuous attempts had been made to prevent the fight taking place, and the Duval Club, of Jacksonville, had been much harassed by the action of Governor Mitchell and the sheriff of the county, who made every effort to stop it.

The Governor ordered the state militia out and the club had leased a railway for the purpose of conveying the fighters and their friends and those who had purchased tickets to see the contest to some place sufficiently remote from Jacksonville to ensure non-interference by the authorities during the progress of the battle.

On Wednesday, however, Judge Call issued an injunction order forbidding the Governor, sheriff, militia and all others from interfering with the fight, on the ground that it did not come under the jurisdiction of the state.

THE MEN ARRESTED. Corbett and Mitchell were arrested as they were leaving the grounds. Sheriff Dowd, under the advice of Attorney General Leman and County Solicitor Christie, swore out a warrant in the County Court charging them with having met by previous arrangement and engaged in a fight.

When they appeared in the County Court the County Solicitor stated that information had been filed before the Criminal Court against all the parties, Corbett and Mitchell as principals, and the others as accessories. He asked that the first charge be dismissed from the County Judge's Court.

Colonel Cockrell, for the defense, applied for a writ of Habeas Corpus before Circuit Judge C. I. The latter said that it being a criminal case it was out of a jurisdiction, and he could not have anything to do with it.

Both Corbett and Mitchell, after nearly two hours delay, were admitted to bail in the sum of \$3,000 each, to appear at nine o'clock to-morrow morning.
