### WHAT BIG GRAIN CROP MEANS

Canada's granary this year holds 163,000,000 bushels of wheat more than last year, as well as 94,000,000 more bushels of oats and greatly increased yields of other grains. Business generally in every province of the Dominion will feel an impetus as a result of the transporting and marketing of the big grain crop, but the effect in the Prairie provinces can hardly be estimated. One Western writer says Saskatchewan, because of its 27,000,000 bushels of wheat, has staged a "90 per cent comeback" in one short year.

Among other things for which the Maritime Provinces can claim precedence is the first town planning in Canada which was undertaken at Sydney, N. S. by the Royal Engineers in 1784, according to the Tourist and Convention Bureau of the Canadian National Railways. Nova Scotia has also the distinction of claiming the first settlement in social club (Fort Royal) 1606; first waterpower 1607; first grist mill same year; first light-house (Louisbourg) 1810; first public school 1749; first board of trade (Halifax) 1750; first printing press 1751; first newspaper 1752; first public gardens 1753; first representative parliament 1758; first English university 1789; first stationery.
