URDAY'S TRADING ON WALL ST. **SOLD IN PARIS**

New York, May 21.—The stimular for the speculative advance in stock today was the result of the report of the placing of American bonds 1 Paris. The subject remained in the rumor stage, but positive prediction were heard in stock market circle that formal announcements on the subject would be forthcoming early next week. Meantime no confirmation could be had for these vague rumors from the bankers and rail road officials supposed to be most nearly concerned in them. Along with the bond saler rumors. came the revival of stories that United States Steel was to be listed in Paris. Estimates as to the amount of the alleged bond sales in Paris were raised materially above those advanced when the subject first came to stock market attention.

There is nothing in the known transactions of the week to explain the actual increase of \$14,000,000 in the paris. The \$100,000 in cash, however, left amargin of increase in the surplus of \$3,886,275 in spite of the expandent to explain the easing of the money market. This ease of the local money market is a factor, also, in the persistent rise in foreign exchange. The stock market closed irregular and at a reaction from the high prices.
