After a good passage the big C. P. R. liner Mount Temple arrived in port yesterday afternoon and docked at 2 o'clock at No. 1 berth, Sand Point. She came from London and Antwerp direct and brought to this port 677 passengers of which 532 were destined for Canada and the remainder for the United States...

The Mount Temple is in command of Captain James H. Moore, who was on the vessel last year. Her chief officer is W. J. T. Barker, formerly of the Montrose, the ship on which Dr. Crippen sailed for this country. Her other officers are as follows: 3rd officer, G. R. Hudson; 4th, W. S. Brown; chief engineer, E. Starley; surgeon, Dr. W. A. Smith; purser, G. F. Philpott; chief steward, J. A. Ashurst. Mr. Philpott was formerly assistant purser on the Empress of Britain when Wm. Webber was purser of that ship.

Winter Port Notes. Donaldson Line steamship Cassandra, Captain Mitchell, left Liverpool, G. B., for St. John on Saturday with passengers and general cargo. She comes direct. The Donaldson Line steamship Kastalia, Captain Mitchell, is scheduled to sail this morning for Botwoodville, N.B., to load pulp for the United Kingdom.

Athenia Arrives. The Donaldson Line steamship Athenia, Captain Macneil, arrived in port yesterday morning from Glasgow and went to No. 1 berth on the West Side where she landed 234 passengers and 55 horses, after which she moved over to the new city wharf to discharge cargo for this city. Captain Macneil reports a very rough passage across the Atlantic and during the last three days a heavy gale from the northeast with rain, sleet and snow...

Struck Derelict. The little schooner sailed from Windsor, N. S., early Friday morning with a cargo of barrel heads and staves consigned to St. John. They called at Blomidon and put to sea again on Friday night. The sea was running very high and there was a fierce gale, but the little craft managed to stand against it until Saturday morning when she struck a sunken derelict with such force that the sides of the schooner were crushed like paper. Before the men could get their clothes she filled and rolled over.
