Girl Sues To Annul Her Two Marriages

Only Fifteen Years Old—Both Husbands Believed Her to be Eighteen.

New York, June 15.—Florence Cobleigh, the 15-year-old Brooklyn girl who married twice within five months, is plaintiff in two suits for the annulment of her marriages, on the ground that on both occasions she was under age. It is the first time in Kings county that two actions for annulment have been begun at the same time by the same plaintiff.

Supreme Court Justice Squires has signed the girl's father, Herbert Cobleigh, a printer, or 61 Moore street, Brooklyn, her guardian.

The girl has only been out of school a few months when in November, 1920, she married Robert Brocklehurst, 19, of 623 Gates avenue. They quarreled and separated in April, 1921, she married Otto George Berg, 22, of 177 110th street, Richmond Hill. Both husbands believed she was 18. The girl is now in the custody of the Children's Society as a juvenile delinquent.

Slight Decrease In Cost of Living Ottawa, June 15.—A slight decrease in the cost of living is recorded in a statement issued by the department of labor.

The average cost of a list of 29 staple foods in sixty cities at the first of May, was \$12.25 as compared with \$12.00 in April, 1920, and \$12.42 in May, 1914.

The total for foods, fuel and rent in the sixty cities averaged \$22.84 in May, as compared with \$23.31 in April, \$26.44 in May, 1920, \$21.92 in May, 1919 and \$14.19 in May 1914.

Country Products Down. The chief changes for the month were decreases in eggs, milk, butter and potatoes with slight increases in nearly all the other items.

Coal, wood and coal oil, averaged slightly lower. Rents averaged higher in Ontario and Quebec.

The departments index number of wholesale prices stood at 217.3 for May as compared with 237.7 for April, 1919; 275.8 for May, 1918; 243.8 for May, 1917; 185.3 for May, 1916 and 128.9 for May, 1914.

The chief changes for the month were decreases in dairy products, animals and meats, grains and fodder, textiles and in building materials.

LONE TRAPPER DEAD. The Pas, Man., June 12.—The death of a lonely trapper, the third within a few months, has been reported here. The body of a man named Connolly having been found in a shack on the Cross Lake Portage 20 miles south of Thicket Portage on the Hudson Bay Railway. The provincial police are investigating.
