FREDERICTON

Fredricton, N. B., March 27.—(Special.) It will cost the taxpayers of Fredericton \$80,000 to run the city machine this year, the new city council at a meeting this evening having decided to assess for that amount.

This is an increase of \$8,000 over the assessment for last year and breaks all records in the city's history. The principal item of increase is one of \$20,000 to pay the interest on the sum of \$80,000 to be expended on sewerage this year.

The grant in support of schools was increased from \$10,000 to \$15,000. The controllable expenditure amounts to \$37,000, being an increase of about \$2,000 over last year.

In roads and streets and public works departments the assessment was reduced from last year.

Several aldermen spoke strongly in favor of granting the policemen an increase of salary from \$1.50 to \$2.00 a week, but the committee on the subject has not yet reported.

The force, including Sergeant Phillips, receive \$1.25 per day each.

The sewerage committee at a meeting this evening decided on the recommendation of Engineer Harbour to award the contract for supplying electric apparatus for the sewerage pumping station to the Canada Foundry Company of Toronto for \$4,000.

PENNSYLVANIA COURT APPOINTS GUARDIAN FOR ESTATE OF MRS. HENRY B. COXE

PAID FIANCÉE'S BILLS
Sons Declare Wealthy Coal Operator's Widow is Under Influence of English Physician, and Had Announced Engagement to Dr. Hill of Liverpool.

Philadelphia, Pa., March 27.—Alarmed by the announcement that Mrs. Henry B. Coxe intended to marry Dr. Hill of Liverpool (Eng.), on April 17, her two sons and a brother appeared in court at West Chester (Pa.) today and asked that a guardian be appointed to take charge of her property.

Mr. and Mrs. John A. Brown respectively. She was Miss Isabelle Brown before her marriage to Mr. Coxe, a wealthy coal operator, who died in Brussels eighteen months ago.

With an income of more than \$30,000 a year on this estate, Mrs. Coxe has not lived up to it. Her income on deposits which she has allowed accumulate is at present \$238,000. The principal of her father's estate, or her portion of it, amounts to more than \$200,000, while her share in the principal of her grandfather's estate is \$124,000. After hearing testimony, the court appointed the Grand Trust Company of this city, guardian of the property of Mrs. Coxe.

Startling revelations were made as to the influence that Dr. Hill has over Mrs. Coxe. It was testified that he is a port physician in Liverpool at \$2,000 a year. He is ten years the junior of Mrs. Coxe, who is between forty-three and sixty-four years old. His hotel bills when he was with Mrs. Coxe were paid by her, as well as heavy bills for champagne. Mrs. Coxe herself, according to the testimony, was nervous, suffering from dizziness and a weak mind. This was accredited to a stroke of apoplexy she suffered three years ago.

One doctor said that she behaved in a silly manner, "like a girl of sixteen," in the presence of all men whom she called her friends. His hotel bills when he was with Mrs. Coxe were paid by her, as well as heavy bills for champagne. Mrs. Coxe herself, according to the testimony, was nervous, suffering from dizziness and a weak mind. This was accredited to a stroke of apoplexy she suffered three years ago.

Two physicians, Henry B. Coxe, jr., and Charles E. Coxe, were present, as well as John A. Brown, jr., her brother. The third son, Alexander Brown Coxe, is in Paris. It is said that he occurred in the petition for a guardian.

Mrs. Coxe was represented in court by Evan Shelby, a New York lawyer. For the sons there appeared George Tucker Bagshaw and John Hampton, attorneys at law. The case was read from Dr. Robert C. Miles, of New York, stating that Mrs. Coxe was physically unable to travel to Liverpool, and that she was suffering from dizziness and a slight attack of apoplexy some years ago, which might recur if she became excited. He had seen her several times in the last three months. She is unable to carry on a rapid conversation, he said, and has a poor memory and weak comprehension of what is said to her. Notices of Dismissal Being Issued Daily and Speculation is Rife as to Where the Axe Will Fall Next

The information is given by the general manager's office daily dispensing with the services of men. It is said the older clerks will be first dealt with, and they may be detailed in the service until the pension scheme comes into force. The reduction also strikes the train despatchers.
