Immigration and Population.

For the year ending June 30, 1894, immigration into the United States is shown to have been smaller than for any previous year since 1886, and with that exception the smallest in the entire period since 1879. The year's total, as indicated by the preliminary statement of the Treasury Department, was 301,404, which represents about 99 per cent. of the complete exhibit. For the preceding year the total was 502,917, and for ten years ending with 1893, the annual average was 487,000; for ten years ouding with 1890 the annual average was 533,000.

The year'y average rate of gain of population from 1880 to 1890, according to the census returns, was 1.3 per cent., exclusive of immigration, as compared with 2 per cent. for such increase in the preceding decade. Applying the 1.3 per cent. rate to find the natural increase in population, and adding the yearly immigration, the indicated p pulation of the United States on July 1 of each year since 1880 is shown in the following compilation by the Cincinnati Price Current:
