RICHARDSON, BENJAMIN PARKYN. [Wolseley.]

Third S. of the late Rev. G. T. Richardson, Methodist Minister of Toronto Conference, who came to Canfrom Eng. in 1854. B. in Co. of York, Ont. 22 July, 1857. Ed. in the Public Schools of the Co. and the Uxbridge High Sch. M., 3rd Oct., 1882 at Philadelphia, Pa. to Miss M. E. Austin, formerly of Toronto. Taught School for six years at Uxbridge, and then engaged in farming and stock raising. Settled in N. W. T. 1884. A farmer and stock breeder. Is a dir. of the Grenfell Cheese, Co., and of the Grenfell Agricultural Society, and Inspector of Agencies, London and Lancashire Life Assur. Co. for Man. and N.W.T. Elected to Leg. Assem. at g. e. 1888. A Conservative.—Grenfell.

RICHARDSON, Hon. Mr. Justice HUGH.

B. in London, Eng., July, 1826. Came to U.C. with his family in Aug. 1831 and settled in Little York, where his father became the first manager of the Bank of Upper Canada. Called to Bar, U.C., in 1847. Was Crown Attorney for the Co. of Oxford from 1857 to 1862. Served as Senior Major of the Provisional Batt, V.M. in active service at La Prairie, during the winter 1864-65. Was Lieut.-Col. Commanding at Sarnia during the Fenian Invasion, from March to July 1866. Commanded 22nd Oxford Rifles from 1866 to 1875 when he retired with Was Chief Clerk, Dept. of Justice, from 1872 to 1876 when apptd. Stipendiary Magistrate and Legal Adviser to Lieut.-Gov., N.W.T., at the seat of Govt. Was ex officio a mem. of the late N. W. Council. Is now a Legal Expert occupying a seat in the Assem .-Battleford, N.W.T.
