

DEXTER, *Hon.* ISAAC VINCENT, J.P.

Descended from an old Puritan stock, ancestors having removed from Massachusetts to Queen's Co. N.S. about 1760. B. in Brooklyn, N. S., 1824, and ed. there. M. in Liverpool, N. S., 1852, Agnes, second dau. of William Gold, Esq. Is a merchant and a J. P. Has been a Municipal Councillor for many years, and held a Captaincy in the Militia until 1867. Apptd. to L. C. 8 April, 1884. A Liberal.—*Brooklyn, Queen's Co. N.S.*

DICKIE, *Hon.* JOHN BARNHILL.

Of Scotch-Irish parentage. Ancestors came to N. S. from Londonderry, Irel., about 1760, and were among the earliest settlers in Cornwallis after the removal of the French Acadians. Many members of the family have at various times held seats in Parl. and other prominent positions. Eld. s. of the late Isaac P. Dickie, of Cornwallis, by Rebecca Barnhill, of Onslow. B. at Canard, 30 March, 1829. Ed. at Horton, Sackville and Halifax. M., 1st, Oct. 1850, Ellen, eld. dau. of the late Timothy Putnam, Esq., of Stewiacke, Colchester Co. (she d.); 2nd, July, 1858, Harriet, eld. dau. of Hugh Dickson, Esq., of Onslow, Colchester, Co. A large shipowner, and has been extensively engaged in business. Is *Cystus Rotulorum* of the Co. of Colchester; Commr. of Schools; Presdt. of the Truro Marine Insu. Co. Was agent at Truro for the Merchants' Bank till 1878. Elected to Ho. of Assem. for Colchester at g.e. 1874, and was Speaker of the Leg. Assem., but resigned near close of first session. Called to L.C. 15 Aug., 1878. A Liberal.—*Truro, N.S.*

FRANCHEVILLE, *Hon.* CHARLES MULLER.

S. of Edmund H. Francheville, Esq., who came from the U.S., by Sarah, dau. of Thomas Peart, Esq. B. at Guysborough, N.S., 24 Feb. 1846, and ed. there. M. June 1868, Miss Harriet Amelia Joet. A merchant. Was captain of sailing vessels for seven years. Is Capt. and Adj. 3rd Regt. Guysborough militia, and Consular Agent for the U.S. and Lloyd's agent at Guysborough. Sat for Guysboro' from March, 1874, until called to L.C. 12 Aug. 1878. A Reformer.—*Guysborough, N.S.*
