LEES, WILLIAM. (South Lanark.)

Father, William Lees, and family, emigrated from Scotland in 1817, and settled in the Township of Bathurst, now in the Co. of Lanark, Ont. B. 1821, in the Township of Bathurst. Ed. there. M., 1st. 1844, Mary daughter of Col. Playfair (she d.); 2nd, Annie Laurie, formerly school teacher in the Town of Perth. A farmer, and saw and grist mill owner. Has had a seat in the Township and Co. Councils since 1856. Held the office of Warden of the Co. in 1874-75-76. Has been a J.P. since 1852. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative, and does not believe there can be good legislation where extensive partyism exists.— Fallbrook, Ont.

LIVINGSTON, JAMES. (South Waterloo.)

First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal. -Baden, Ont.

LONG, THOMAS. (North Simcoe.)

B. at Mount David, Limerick, Ireland, 1836. Ed. there. Came to Can. 1850. M., 1861, Ann, eldest dau. of Mr. Charles Patton, of Collingwood. A store keeper. Was a Councilman of Collingwood from 1864 to 1870. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at g.e. 1875; re-elected at last g.e. A Conservative, and opposed to the present Govt.—Collingwood.

LYON, ROBERT ADAM. (Algoma.)

A brother of W. D. Lyon, Esq., M.P.P. for Ha'ton. First returned to Parlt on resignation of sitting mem., Sept. 1878. Reelected at last g.e. A Reformer. Michael's Bay, Ont.
