

Alma, affair of Bulganac, McKenzie's Farm, capture of Balaclava, battle of Inkermann, siege and fall of Sebastopol; specially mentioned in the despatches of Lord Raglan for having, when in command of a detachment of the 4th Regt., in the advanced trench before Sebastopol, repulsed two attacks of the Russians on the night of the 22nd Nov., 1854; and again thanked in Lord Raglan's despatch for his conduct at the attack and occupation of the Cemetery, 18 June, 1855, on which occasion he was Aide-de-Camp to Lt.-Genl. Sir Wm. Eyre, K.C.B. (Medal with three clasps; Kaffir war medal; Brevet of Major; Knight of the Legion of Honor of France; Knight of the Order of Medjidie of Turkey, and Turkish war medal). Is author of *The Regulations and Orders for the Militia of the Dominion* (1870), and of *The Orders and Regulations for Brigade Camps of Exercise and Instruction for the Militia* (1870.) (Salary \$4,000.)
