of the marine; the 10,500,000 for the ordinary of the colonies; and 7,162,850 livres, appropriated to the extraordinary expences, amounting in all to 47,662,850 livres, shall continue to be issued at the disposition of the Marine Minister, at the rate of a twelfth part of the whole for each month to the end of the year 1790, he being always responsible for the fame.

Oct. 10th

M. Fretean, flated that 30 fhips of the 45 voted by the Affembly on the 25th of August, were equipped; and that the Committee were of opinion, from the continued atmaments of England, that the remaining 15 should be equipped with all possible expedicion: in this opinion the Affembly coincided.

M. Malouet reported from the Marine Committee; that they had received a letter from the Marine Minister, defiring the farther fum of 4,958,218 livres; on account of the armament. The Affembly decreed;

1st. That the fum of 4,958,218 livres be placed under the controul of the Marine Department, to the account of the expence of fitting out forty-five fail of the line, decreed by the Affembly.

2d. That the account of payments for provifions for the fupply of the fleet shall be prefented to the Affembly monthly.

3d. That on the 1ft of January next, an account shall be given in of the sums received and expended on account of provisions for the sleer, and from the 1ft of January 1791, a contract shall be entered into for such supply.
