1. Bill to amend "The Canada Temperance Amendment Act, 1888," (Mr. Flint); Ordered; Presented, 111. Read a second time, 164. Committed; Reported, 167. Passed, 177. By the Senate, 231. R.A., 234. (55-56 Vic., c. 26.)
2. Petitions praying for a Prohibitory Liquor Law, 294.
3. Motion by Mr. Charlton, that public opinion as to prohibition of Intoxicating Liquors should be ascertained by a reference of the Question to the people at the Polls; Motion withdrawn, 318.
