

The Liberal Monthly, which contained a review of matters of current political interest, and a record of the party's work in and out of parliament. Pamphlets and leaflets were also issued from time to time, together with reprints of portions of the more important speeches made by Liberals in parliament. Under the direction of Sir Wilfrid Laurier and a small committee, I had charge of the organization and management of this office, more particularly the information branch from 1911 to 1914, was editor, for that period, of the Liberal Monthly, and of the party pamphlets and leaflets, many of which I also wrote. There was a small staff, one part of which was concerned with the preparation and distribution of party literature and one part with the work of organization in the constituencies. In the latter connection, the office was, with the aid of a national organizer, kept in touch with all riding associations, and saw that their officers were supplied with party literature and kept advised of matters of special interest. The office assisted in the organization of political tours, the organization of meetings in the constituencies, and in supplying speakers as well as literature. When the war came on and a party truce was declared, the activities of the National
