Ottawa, May 1, 1912.

Sir,-

The Department desires to enlarge the basement of the school building on the Assiniboine Reserve and also to fix up the cabin which was erected for the use of Indians who bring their children to the school in order that it may be fit for occupation by the teacher.

This work is to be done by day labour under the supervision of yourself with the assistance of the farmer. In the event of neither yourself or the farmer being familiar with concrete I have to ask you to be good enough to state whether you can obtain the services of a competent man. No doubt there will be no trouble in having the necessary carpenter work done. I should be glad to have an early reply and instructions will then be given you in reference to the work.
