Sovereign Lord the King his heirs and Successors;
to the true payement whereof I bind Myself, My heirs, and
assigns firmly by these presents Witness My Hand and Seal this

in the

year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Sixty eight
and in the eighth year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord
George the third by the Grace of God of Great Britain France
and Ireland King Defender of the Faith and so forth.

The Condition of this obligation is such, that whereas the said
hath obtained a Licence
of this date to trade with the Indians in the Countries reserved by
the King for their Hunting and not annexed to any particular
Province. Now if the said

Doth well and truly in all things conform to and observe the
Several Restrictions and Regulations required in his Majesty's
Proclamation dated at St. James's, the Seventh day of October one
thousand seven hundred and Sixty three; and also such further
orders and Regulations as may hereafter be made by his
Majesty's Superintendant for Indian Affairs, or any other the
King's officers Serving in these Countries who are properly
authorized to Make Rules and Regulations for the Indian
Trade, then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full
force and Virtue
