- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. So you transferred over your business and your business connections party, figuring it would be beneficial?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. How long did you remain in partnership?
- A. Till around the first of December.
- Q. Three or four months?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Where did your wife and family live at that time?
- A. In the same house.
- Q. They lived in the auto camp?
- A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Were you able to replenish this furniture you had to sell?
- A. Yes. sir.
- Q. What would you assume your earnings to be at that time?
- A. About 250 dollars per month.
- Q. Were you able to save any?
- A. Not very much.
- Q. What did you do after that?
- A. This truck kept breaking down so I sold it. I got the money back that I put into it. We moved into collect, Alberta and rented this rooming house there. I went to work driving for a lumber company, the Storess Lumber company.
- Q. How long did you remain with the Storess Lumber Company?
- A. While I was hauling lumber with my own truck for the company. When I had my own car I was hauling my own props for the Storess Lumber Company. Then I went to work and drove one of the lumber company trucks.
- Q. Then what did you do?
- A. I drove the lumber company truck and then I got my army call.
- Q. At what time was that? Can you give me a date?
- A. It was sometime just after Christmas, sir, in January of 1943 I believe.
