MR.ARTHUR B.BROWN: (Acting for Mr. Twiddle) the owner of lot 2466 just immediately adjoining the Reserve 10B).

MR.ALEXANDER: When did you make that application?

MR.BROWN: The application was forwarded on the 20th of July, 1920, just a year past, to the Department and was accepted by the Department.

MR.ALEXANDER: Would your works pass through the Indian Reserve?

MR.BROWN: Yes, they are bound to.

MR.ALEXANDER: You have to get permission.

MR.BROWN: I have applied for permission over a year ago.

MR.ALEXANDER: We cannot compel them to.

MR.BROWN: I thought the Indian Commission here now would pass on that. We have been held up for so long. I have been waiting for this Commission. I understand the Indian Commission report has gone in now.

MR.ALEXANDER: We will inquire about that when we get back to Victoria and see what the trouble is. What is the flow of the creek, do you know?

MR.BROWN: On the 15th of July it was 3 cubic feet and on August 22nd it was a little over two.

MR.BALLS: I am not familiar with the stream at all. I have not
